Knit on I-cord Edging




Materials:

- Any round knitting loom; or single sided knitting rake.
- Use a yarn that is appropriate for your loom of choice.
- Loom hook/tool.
- Tapestry needle.
- Optional: row counter.

I-Cord Cast on:

Note: Below are instructions for a sample swatch, these are I the parentheses.

- 1. Start by determining how many stitches wide your piece will be. (For example let's say 20 stitches.)
- 2. Create a 3 stitch I-cord that is twice as many rows long as your piece will be wide. (For this example 40 rows long.)
- 3. Choose one line of stitches on the I-cord to work with. Take a 'leg' from a stitch in this line and place it on the first peg to the left of the I-cord stitches.





- 4. Place a 'leg' from every other row along that line on the I-cord and place them on the next (19) pegs.
- 5. Lift the three cast on loops of the I-cord and place them on the three pegs to the left of the (20) ones that were just cast on from the I-cord line. (total 26 stitches)

I-Cord edging:


Note: these directions are for staring on the left side of the loom and working toward the right.

- 1. The working yarn should be at the beginning of the newly cast on stitches. E-wrap the (20) center stitches.
- 2. Flat stitch (Or use the U-turn flat stitch wrap) the last 3 I-cord stitches.
- 3. Bring the working yarn behind the three I-cord stitches and between the 3rd and 4th pegs to the front of the loom. (see photo)



- 4. Knit off the center stitches, and then purl each stitch to make the garter stitch pattern.
- 5. Once all center stitches are knit and purled, bring the working yarn back into the center of the loom before the last 3 stitches; pass the yarn behind the 3 last pegs bring it around the right side of the last peg and around the front and flat stitch the 3 l-cord stitches.

6. Repeat steps 1-5 until the piece reaches your desired length. Cast off as usual, or use the I-cord cast off to have an I-cord edging worked all the way around the piece.

I-Cord Cast off:

Note: If using this cast off method, be sure that you have ended work on your piece with the working yarn on the left, ending with step 5 above.

- 1. Starting on the right side of the piece, move the three I-cord stitches over one peg each to the left. (The left most will be placed on the first of the center stitches of the piece.)
- 2. Take the working yarn behind the three I-cord stitches bring it around the right side of the last peg and around the front and flat stitch the 3 I-cord stitches.
- 3. Repeat step 2.
- 4. Repeat steps 1-3 until all the stitches are 'cast off except all the I-cord stitches from both sides.
- 5. Cut the working yarn leaving a 12" tail.
- 6. Secure the active stitches by running the yarn tail through them and use the <u>end to end invisible</u> <u>stockinet seam method</u> to join and finish the edge.
